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#### President's Message

#### **PET - Practice question, Evidence and Translation**



Hello to our old Fellows and welcome to our new Fellows! The Hong Kong College of Education and Research in Nursing (HKCERN) consists of 134 Fellows, serving in different sectors, including university settings (47%), schools of nursing in Hospital Authority or post-secondary institutions (32%) and clinical care or management (21%). Though our Fellows are practising in different work places or settings, all have been awarded the title of Fellow by the Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing [FHKAN (Education and/or Research)], thus being well versed in education and/or actively engaged in research. The ultimate goal of education and research in nursing is to support healthcare services in order to achieve the best possible quality of care and optimal health outcomes.

In the first two years, the HKCERN had admitted Fellow members who were mainly involved in

pre- or post-registration nurse education. We have continued to have outstanding individuals who are in the above category but in this year, we have also admitted clinicians/managers who have demonstrated outstanding performance in patient and family education. The realization of the significant and intertwined relationships between nursing education, research and practice can probably be expressed through the process of PET (i.e., Practice question, Evidence and Translation process) advocated by Johns Hopkins Nursing Evidence-based Practice Model and Guidelines (Newhouse et al 2007). The HKCERN now has good representation of Fellows who can pose meaningful practice questions, generate evidence through research and translate new knowledge into practice. Through the PET process, we can enhance the competence of learners of our next generation and optimize health of the clients that we serve. The HKCERN should definitely take advantage of this multitalented team to make nursing in Hong Kong stronger, together hand-in-hand with other Academy Colleges of the PHKAN.

Two main objects of the PHKAN are to facilitate the exchange of information in the art of science of nursing and protect the public by regulating the standards of advanced nursing practice. To achieve the ultimate statutory status and these objects, we need to set up examinations to confirm and uphold the competence and standards of our advanced practice nurses in Hong Kong. The PHKAN has recently set up an Education Committee to ensure that the training and examinations set by the Academy Colleges are of good standard, being comparable to the international standards of recognized academy and professional associations of nursing. The HKCERN needs input from each of the Fellows to contribute in various capacities, including being mentors, educators and examiners. Please do take the initiation to approach us in the area that you can offer help. Let us join hands and make our nurses be a strong professional group to serve the community of Hong Kong, being a city that shines and shares international pride!
